The depths of Christ's love are well beyond our understanding. Even here in familiar territory - the disciples who are fishermen once more in their element, at home on the Sea of Galilee, fail to recognise the significance of what is going on, of what has gone on in Jesus, of who Jesus really is. He has to break bread with them again to give them a clue, to open their eyes, to re-member them in their remembrance of Christ. Later it will all get written down as yet one more item in this understanding we all share in what God has done for us in Christ. This story continues to unfold in each of us in unique and different ways - 153 fish indicating innumerable ways, or an infinite number of people, all held fast in the one net to be spent, consumed at love's leisure, each in turn a witness to God's infinite capacity to love. In this sense we share in the Eucharist at our peril, here not for ourselves only but to be broken on the sacrificial altar of God's love and resurrected, re-membered, as we do so.

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
